Chicago Police Pound Fire "Fighters" In Worthy Cause

Department earned bragging rights for another year by pummeling the Chicago Fire Department in the 2nd Annual "Battle of the Badges" boxing event for police and fire charities. The event was held on September 20, 2003, in the St. Rita High School gymnasium, 7740 South Western.

In donning boxing gloves and headgear and armed with the courage to enter the ring, members of both Departments helped raise more than \$30,000 for worthy causes. Police charities benefiting from the event included St. Michael's House, the Chicago Police Peer Support Program, and Concerns of Police Survivors (COPS).

Officer **Ken Corcoran**, Unit 132, served as the Department's principal organizer, utilizing his vast experience as a boxer, trainer, promoter, and judge. To provide the best competition,

Corcoran carefully matched CPD and CFD members of various ranks, ages, weight, and experience levels to engage in the three one-minute round contests.

The Chicago Police won seven of

the 11 action-packed bouts in front of about 1,800 spectators.

The participants, who underwent months of intense training, deserve high praise because the contests were serious competitions. Retired Chicago Police Detective Austin Corcoran, Ken Corcoran's father, helped train the CPD fighters in Leo High School on the South Side. "They impressed me with their determination and dedication," said the elder Corcoran. "A couple of these fighters could legitimately compete professionally."

The young boxers were equally as impressed with the rugged 66-year-old pugilist's strength-conditioning program. "I told them that I don't expect them to do anything that I can't do myself," said the elder Corcoran as he lifted dumbbells and then dropped for a series of push-ups.

Assistant State's Attorney Mike Joyce helped secure Leo High School
